### Jesus

### Answer Sheet

#### What did Jesus say about the bread and wine at the Last Supper?

- Over the bread, Jesus said: "Take and eat; this is my body."
- Over the cup, He said words to the effect of: "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins."
- These words form the basis of the priest's words of consecration at every Mass.
- They are also the foundation for the Catholic belief that, through consecration, the bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Christ.

#### What happened in the Garden of Gethsemane, and what did Peter do afterward?

- In the garden, Jesus prayed to the Father: "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; still, not my will but yours be done."
- His prayer revealed both His true human anguish and His perfect obedience to the Father's will.
- According to Luke's Gospel, His agony was so intense that His sweat became like drops of blood falling to the ground.
- When He returned to the disciples, He found them asleep.
- Judas then arrived and betrayed Jesus with a kiss, and Jesus was arrested.
- One of the disciples struck the high priest's servant and cut off his ear.
- Jesus rebuked the violence, and in Luke's account He healed the servant's ear.
- After Jesus was arrested, Peter followed at a distance and later denied three times that he knew Him, just as Jesus had predicted.

#### What happened to Jesus on the Cross? What happened immediately after He died?

- While hanging on the Cross, Jesus prayed: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."
- One of the criminals crucified beside Him mocked Him.
- The other acknowledged his guilt and said: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."
- Jesus replied: "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."
- At the end, Jesus cried out: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit," and then He breathed His last.
- Darkness came over the land, and the veil of the Temple was torn in two.
- The centurion, seeing what had happened, glorified God and declared that Jesus was innocent.
- Afterward, Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for the body of Jesus.
- He took the body down and laid it in a new tomb cut into the rock.

#### What did the women find when they went to the tomb of Jesus? What did they do?

- The women found that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb.
- When they entered, they did not find the body of Jesus.

- Two men in dazzling garments appeared to them. These are understood to be angelic messengers.
- They said:
  - “Why do you seek the living one among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised.”
- They reminded the women that Jesus had foretold His Passion, Death, and Resurrection.
- The women then returned and told the apostles and the other disciples what had happened.
- At first, their testimony was not believed.
- Peter ran to the tomb and saw the burial cloths, and he went away amazed at what had happened.

#### **Who approached the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, and what happened?**

- As the two disciples were discussing the events of Jesus’ Passion and Death, Jesus Himself drew near and walked with them.
- However, their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him.
- After they explained what had happened, Jesus rebuked their slowness of heart and said that it was necessary for the Messiah to suffer before entering into His glory.
- Beginning with Moses and all the prophets, He interpreted for them the Scriptures that referred to Him.
- When they reached their destination, they urged Him to stay with them.
- At table, Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them.
- In that moment, their eyes were opened and they recognized Him — and He vanished from their sight.
- They then returned to Jerusalem and told the others that the Lord had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

#### **What did Jesus do when He appeared to the rest of the disciples?**

- Jesus suddenly stood in their midst and said: “Peace be with you.”
- The disciples were startled and frightened, thinking they were seeing a spirit.
- Jesus showed them His hands and feet and invited them to touch Him, saying that a spirit does not have flesh and bones as He did.
- To show that He was truly risen in the body, He ate food in their presence.
- He then reminded them that everything written about Him in the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms had to be fulfilled.
- He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures.
- He commissioned them to be witnesses to His Passion, Resurrection, and the forgiveness of sins preached in His name.
- Later, He led them out toward Bethany, and He was taken up into heaven.

**What happened at Pentecost, and what did the Apostles do afterward? What did Peter say about Jesus?**

- On Pentecost, there came a noise like a strong driving wind, and tongues as of fire appeared and came to rest on each of them.
- The Apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues.
- Jews from many nations were present in Jerusalem, and they were amazed to hear the Apostles speaking in their own languages.
- Peter stood up and explained that what was happening fulfilled the words of the prophet Joel.
- He proclaimed that Jesus, whom they had crucified, had been raised up by God and exalted at His right hand.
- Peter called the people to repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of their sins.
- He promised that they too would receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.
- About three thousand persons were baptized that day.
- Afterward, the believers devoted themselves to:
  - the teaching of the apostles
  - fellowship and the communal life
  - the breaking of the bread
  - the prayers
- They shared their possessions with those in need, and the Lord added to their number day by day.
